From the Chair and Executive Director

27.5 million: That is the total population served by Amigos member libraries.* Our academic libraries serve over 4.8 million college and university students.** Those are truly impressive numbers! The impact our member libraries have on their various communities inspires Amigos to deliver even more continuing education opportunities, better discount services, and more diverse programs to serve our member institutions.

During FY2007, staff from Amigos member libraries continued to build their professional knowledge by attending Amigos educational sessions. 2,671 people, most from member institutions, participated in 298 classes from Amigos. The 298 classes were comprised of 144 different courses, reflecting again this year the diversity required to meet library learning needs.

Amigos helped implement OCLC services throughout the region via support and training, especially through the free OCLC Training Pass program and the popular (and free) STOP & Learn online series.

Five new vendor partners were added to the A-Plus Member Discount Program during FY2007, further expanding this program to leverage the consortial buying power of Amigos members. A-Plus provides thousands of supply items and electronic resources at affordable rates via partnerships with over 50 service providers. Through A-Plus, members have the advantage of one-stop shopping at discounted prices.

During FY2007, Amigos Trustees focused on strategic planning, engaging member input through a variety of surveys, focus groups, and individual discussions. During this time of change for the library profession, Amigos faces changes in the ways we deliver services as well as the services we deliver. The Board has defined two strategic directions for your network: 1) the value of continuing to expand Amigos' diverse array of services to meet the changing needs of members, and 2) members' preference to have Amigos continue to play a strong support role in member use of OCLC services. In FY2007, in addition to providing more diverse services than ever before, we finished the year in the strongest financial position Amigos has ever experienced. The timing of this strong financial performance is important, because it positions Amigos to explore diverse opportunities and implement new programs to meet member needs.

The details in this FY2007 Annual Report reflect the many ways Amigos' 750+ members gain strength by working collaboratively to meet today's library challenges.



2007 Highlights

Amigos Fellowship Program

A-Plus Member Discount Program

Amigos offers members discounted pricing and ease of purchase on thousands of reliable programs and services. Members save money through Amigos' partnerships with leading providers of library technologies, from electronic journals and books to library and archival supplies.

- 163 members saved over \$225,000 on subscriptions to Project MUSE in FY2007. Additionally, Amigos serves as coordinator for the INCOLSA, Oberlin, and CSU/SEIR consortial programs.
- 96 members saved \$159,000 on subscriptions to the Oxford English Dictionary.
- 46 members invested in the NetLibrary Shared Resource Collection VII. Members benefited from access to over 1,180 titles, averaging \$11.27 per title, per institution.
- 28 members saved \$188,175 on subscriptions to the Association for Computing Machinery.
- 11 vendor partner educational update sessions were coordinated at the 2007 Amigos Member Conference, helping members take maximum advantage of available subscription services.
- 6 presentations and update sessions on the discounts available through Amigos were presented at state library association conferences around the region.
- 5 new vendor partners were added to the program: Atlas Systems, Inc., Creative DataProducts, Library Design Systems, Inc., MPS Technologies, and Sage Publications.
- 4 informational webinars and online demos were presented to inform members of new products and technologies available through the discount program.

BioOne®

Amigos serves as the exclusive marketing and sales agent for BioOne in the United States and Canada.

- 744 North American institutions subscribed to BioOne at the close of FY2007, an increase of 7% over FY2006.
- Amigos members continue to receive a 13% discount on BioOne subscriptions.

• In January 2007, BioOne launched BioOne.2, a second collection of journals in the biosciences.

Scholars' Marketplace

Scholars' Marketplace is a scholarly publishing distribution program developed by Amigos to partner notfor-profit scholarly content providers with libraries by offering scholarly, peer-reviewed content at affordable prices. Partnerships for FY2007 included: American Accounting Association, Communication Institute for Online Scholarship, GeoScienceWorld, and Project Euclid.

Continuing Education

FY2007 was an active year for Continuing Education at Amigos, involving building many partnerships with other agencies and expanding the course catalog. 180 people attended the 2007 Amigos Member Conference, May 2-3 in Dallas. 2,671 staff, mostly from Amigos member institutions, participated in 298 face-to-face, live online, and videoconference sessions offered by Amigos in FY2007. Members participated in 144 different course topics available, including:

- 64 Face-to-Face
- 58 Live Online
- 5 Self-paced and video
- 9 STOP & Learn
- 8 Co-sponsored courses

Amigos added to the diversity of topics with 11 workshops on 8 different topics presented by co-sponsoring organizations and adjunct trainers. Partners included: Serials Cataloging Cooperative Training Program (SCCTP), the Association for Research Libraries, the Association for Collections and Technical Services, and 8 independent consultants.

Amigos coordinated a pilot project with the Serials Cataloging Cooperative Training Program to add online instruction to the SCCTP offerings. Amigos trained 15 serials specialists to facilitate online learning and advised SCCTP on converting courses for online presentation.

Amigos provided training to the New Mexico State Library, the Washington State Library, Tampa Bay Library Consortium, and Bibliographical Center for Research (BCR) through various contracts.

This year, Amigos participated with WebJunction in a pilot project for WebJunction to resell regional network online courses. Amigos is one of three networks participating in the pilot.

Amigos contracted with the Texas Historical Records Advisory Board (THRAB) and with the Arkansas State Library to provide basic preservation & imaging training across Texas and Arkansas.*

Amigos continued working with the Society of American Archivists, BCR, and the Missouri Library Network Corporation (MLNC) to provide preservation training to their members.*

Training partnerships reduce member costs, increasing access to high-quality training. In FY2007, Amigos:

· Continued to participate in the Network Education Exchange with 11 networks. This partnership provides broader access to online training for Amigos members, who are able to participate in training from other networks at membership prices.

- · Co-sponsored the NISO educational program Managing Electronic Collections: Strategies from Content to User, Denver, CO, on September 28-30, 2006.
- Continued to collaborate with OCLC and other U.S. networks to provide access to training via the Clearing house for web-based education on OCLC's website.
- Expanded the hosting of live online technology used by partnering networks from 4 (in FY2006) to 7 (in FY2007). Partners include BCR, INCOLSA, MLC, NEBASE, NELI NET, PALINET, and SOLINET.
- Continued to develop reciprocal member pricing for face-toface training with BCR, MLNC, PALINET, and SOLINET.
- Offered registration discounts to members at NISO events and three Information Today conferences: WebSearch University, Computers in Libraries, and Internet Librarian.

Imaging and Preservation

The Amigos Imaging & Preservation Service (IPS) provides valuable information and assistance to members. The Imaging and Preservation Service is funded in part by a grant from the Division of Preservation and Access of the National Endowment for the Humanities. During FY2007, IPS:

- · Conducted 5 site surveys at member sites.
- Presented 3 sessions on imaging and preservation topics at the 2007 Amigos Member Conference.
- · Conducted a State of Texas Alliance for Response Taskforce (START) forum in Beaumont, TX.
- · Co-sponsored Persistence of Memory: Stewardship of Digital Assets conference in Tucson, AZ with the Northeast Document Conservation Center (NEDCC).
- Represented Amigos in the Texas Heritage Digitization Initiative (THDI) and at the Texas Digital Library planning sessions.
- IMLS and Heritage Preservation invited Amigos to participate as a National Preservation Expert in Connecting to Collections: The National Conservation Summit.
- Continued the active role with the Regional Alliance for Preservation (RAP), promoting and coordinating the activities of regional preservation programs nationwide.

OCLC: New Programs and Enhancements

126 Amigos member libraries (158 individuals) took advantage of free, online learning through the free OCLC Training Pass and the STOP & Learn series.

Amigos supported the implementation of Group Services in New Mexico.

Under OCLC's new Implementation Services program, Amigos conducted QuestionPoint implementation services for 3 libraries.
