What's New in WorldCat **Resource Sharing**

The dust is beginning to settle. Resource sharing completed its migration to the new WorldCat Resource Sharing (WCRS) interface in June 2004. But now that WCRS has growing room, the interface is changing month by month.

Do you know about the new Request Manager search options for retrieving requests from the system? What about the ability to batch print requests as well as print mailing labels and bookstraps? These and other new features, along with the basics, are covered in our Basics of World-Cat Resource Sharing workshop, now at a computer lab near you (or at your desk if you choose live online).

On the management side, an extensive set of statistical reports on your resource sharing activity is now available online. Staff can store scripted conditional messages. You or your staff can learn about these and other changes in our WorldCat Resource Sharing Administrative Functionality workshop, now being presented throughout the Amigos region face-to-face and in live online sessions.

Local Holdings Maintenance: The New Kid on the Training **Block**

The migration of OCLC's Union List system into the Connexion interface is scheduled for February 19, 2006. This will be the end of Passport use for Union List data entry and the dawn of a new era for entering local holdings for all formats into WorldCat.

Because this will be a "hot cutover" and access to the live service will not be available to Amigos until that time, our training classes will begin after the cutover occurs. Amigos will be providing live online sessions for the new Connexion component beginning in March, with face-to-face sessions occurring throughout our April-June training schedule. Dates and times for these sessions will be announced soon.

In preparation for this change, OCLC is currently converting Local Data Records in WorldCat to the MARC21 Format for Holdings Data. Amigos members who want to learn more about this format may be interested in enrolling in the SCCTP Serials Holdings workshop. Amigos hopes to offer this workshop in the Phoenix area in the spring.

QuestionPoint is evolving! New flash chat options will help make virtual reference easier and more interactive for users and librarians. QuestionPoint and 24/7 Reference services products are now migrated and use a common platform, http://www.questionpoint.org/support/migration/index.html. The new chat tool will provide cross-platform accessibility for the patron and librarian side, and co-browsing capability from the 24/7 Reference service.

Learn more about increased flexibility and functions of Reference Cooperative and Reference Management services. Reference services staff and library administrators can hear more during our STOP & Learn focus on QuestionPoint and Virtual Reference.

The STOP & Learn program – STOP is an acronym for Short, Timely, Online, and Pertinent – was developed by Amigos' Continuing Education Services in 2004 as a way to provide Amigos members the latest information on OCLC programs and services.

Other topics include CONTENTdm, OCLC cataloging services, FirstSearch, and Union List. Session content is periodically updated as OCLC updates its programs and services. Preserving Digital Objects in an Uncertain Future: What is Your Institution Doing?

How will you keep all your institution's digital documents available for future use? How about digital pictures, sound, or video recordings? Deteriorating storage media, technological obsolescence, and legal issues are all factors that could make today's rich digital resources unavailable tomorrow.

Consisting of four 2-hour live online sessions, this workshop explores the nature of digital resources and hazards that can render them useless, then examines how various institutions are combating the problem. Topics include file formats, software, and hardware. Discussion of current strategies like refreshing and migration as well as possible future strategies will help you plan what your institution can do to ensure the near-term longevity of your valuable digital resources.

Coming this Spring: Records Management

What is records management and how can it benefit your institution? This spring, Amigos will be presenting a new course designed to provide a basic introduction to the concepts that are the foundation of records management. Covering a variety of topics, this course will help you identify your records management needs, and make sure that all record-keeping requirements are met. Other topics include temporary vs. permanent records, defining records and records series, constructing an inventory, and understanding retention schedules.

The purpose of this new exchange program is to provide the members of each participating network with expanded opportunities to develop skills and knowledge via online training, and to provide more cost-effective services by leveraging time and resources among the networks' staff.

Rules and Tools for Cataloging Internet Resources Workshop Scheduled for Dallas

Rules and Tools for Cataloging Internet Resources provides attendees with a solid foundation in the principles and practices of online resource cataloging, using current descriptive cataloging standards (AACR2/MARC21) and practices (LCRI/CONSER/PCC). The course is designed for practicing catalogers from all types of libraries with a working knowledge of the MARC21 bibliographic format and AACR2. The course is intended to instruct attendees in understanding the concepts behind the 2002 AACR2 revisions as they relate to electronic resource cataloging; familiarize attendees with resources available to support online resource cataloging; and address specifics of cataloging and updating online integrating resources, online serials, and online monographs. This workshop will also assist attendees in having a better understanding of how record sets and machine-generated cataloging can be used to support electronic resource record processing.

Open Source Software in Libraries Workshop Scheduled for Houston Area

According to the Open Source Initiative, "the basic idea behind open source is very simple: when programmers can read, redistribute, and modify the source code for a piece of software, the software evolves. People improve it, people adapt it, people fix bugs. And this can happen at a speed that, if one is used to the slow pace of conventional software development, seems astonishing."

This workshop will provide structured opportunities for participants to experience how open source software can be used to implement many library-specific processes. Learn how open source software can help simplify such processes such as reading and writing MARC records, creating and maintaining databases, providing user-friendly interfaces to indexed content, hosting a World Wide Web server, and most importantly, bringing all of these processes together to providing meaningful library collections and services.
