**STATEMENT OF CONCERN**

I was honored to be asked to run for the AMIGOS Board of Directors. The University of Texas Libraries has been a member and supporter of AMIGOS since its inception and has had representation on the Board in past years. Now, more than ever, it's important that the Board maintain representation from an ARL, specifically a large ARL. With the financial constraints facing UT, we are struggling to maintain the services and collections that our faculty and students expect. Each of our libraries are grappling with the changes facing libraries today. We have had to offer new services at the same time we continue traditional services with less staff; we are being forced to stretch our budgets to purchase e-collections that have overtaken the spending for print; we are building storage facilities as fast as we can to make room for the print we no longer need onsite; we are creating learning commons and collaborative spaces for students and patrons to work and learn together; and, adding electrical outlets as fast as our budgets allow. As teaching, learning and studying styles are changing, libraries have to respond. Open access is a big topic on our campus now. How do we bridge the traditional publishing style with the new? We need to continue to have strong experienced leadership to advise AMIGOS on how to help their community of libraries. As a Board, we must provide a vision through our various experiences to keep AMIGOS relevant. To help them remain viable by offering services and support that are timely, beneficial and help the bottom line through the power of collaborative efforts. AMIGOS provides services for all types of libraries and that's why it's important to have the same breadth of representation on the Board. I hope you will consider me as a serious candidate. I believe the issues we are facing at UT extend to the whole library community and that my experience will benefit AMIGOS.
