### STATEMENT OF CONCERN

Having worked in a variety of library settings, I know how vital Amigos can be to a library. I think we have all heard "do more with less" too often, and I know how stretched library budgets can be. In the best interest of a library and its patrons, libraries need to continue to share resources and develop programs, while serving growing populations of users despite budget constraints.

Amigos is an essential component to keeping libraries ahead of the curve. I believe Amigos' efforts can be relevant and beneficial to libraries of all sizes, librarians serving all kinds of populations, and librarians at all points of their careers. In addition to my experience in academic libraries (one very large, one rather small), I also have worked in special libraries and in public libraries. I started in a small public library serving rural areas, worked in a large urban public library, and also directed operations as a solo librarian in a government agency library. I believe I bring a unique perspective to the Board because my career has not been spent in one place. As Amigos continues to evolve, it needs Directors who are creative in meeting new challenges for all the libraries in the region.

My first term on the Board was quite eventful. We sold the building in which our offices are headquartered (and negotiated staying on as tenants). We merged with MLNC, bringing new staff, new directors, and new members into the organization. During my year as Treasurer, the Board felt that Amigos was in a stronger financial state than it had been in a number of years, and decided to use that improvement to increase free member benefits, including the RDA Toolkit and online conferences. In every discussion, the main question has been "Will this benefit our members?"

It has been an honor to serve on the Board for the past three years and I hope that you will allow me to continue the work for another term.
