STATEMENT OF CONCERN

In a time of accelerating change for libraries, both because of technology and because of the bleak economic and political picture which has seen library budgets slashed, the closure of some libraries, and widespread reorganization and consolidation, the challenges facing a regional library cooperative like Amigos cannot be minimized. One has only to look at what has happened in Illinois to realize the scope of these changes.

Certainly, the restructuring of OCLC, with the altered role for the regional networks, which had for many years been the required middlemen between libraries and OCLC, has had major implications. Amigos continues to assist and inform libraries in working with OCLC, and it plays a vital role in facilitating interlibrary loan and cooperation, including the Trans-Amigos Express courier service.

Like any good library cooperative, Amigos has over the years developed a strong mix of value-added and support services for its library members/customers. Up-to-date training programs, purchasing discounts, preservation and disaster assistance, technology assistance, and timely communication, including job listings, have been of real benefit. Strong leadership and a capable staff have been major assets.

The big unknown is how the library picture will change in the next year or two. As libraries scramble to weather the storm, will they recognize the importance of the services and support that Amigos provides?

Continuing close responsiveness to member needs, together with effective marketing and advocacy, will be critical. The Board of Directors will play a key role as we move forward, and I am eager to work with the other Board members and the Amigos team in charting and following a successful course through these turbulent seas of change.
