Total Boox and Tocker Foundation Continue Ebooks for Rural Libraries

Austin, TX — Total Boox, the next evolution in ebook services—maximizing use with unlimited simultaneous access while minimizing cost with payment based on actual reading—and the Tocker Foundation, a non-profit supporting the work of small libraries in Texas, are pleased to announce the continuation of their groundbreaking pilot, which makes Total Boox's collection of nearly 100,000 quality ebooks available to 20 small and rural libraries across the state of Texas.

Therefore, we are never able to afford to have ebooks in our library. Now with this grant from Tocker our library is able to give our patrons the chance to enjoy ebooks. "This is the second year of our project with Tocker. Our goals were, first, to determine whether adding our ebook system to small libraries would benefit the libraries. This was achieved during the first year. All the libraries are getting some usage, and their patrons enjoy Total Boox. People in these towns have never before had library access to so many books in any format, and especially not to the wide range of nonfiction that we provide. Our goal for year two is to increase usage in the libraries. Having significant numbers of patrons using Total Boox will strengthen these small libraries in their communities and demonstrate their relevance in the 21st century, as more people choose to read ebooks. We would like to run similar projects in other states and even outside the USA, and we are looking for organizations willing to sponsor them," said Peyton Stafford, VP of Total Boox.
