STATEMENT OF CONCERN

In a 2011 Viewpoint from the Chair, Bill Hair (the Chair, Amigos Board of Directors), claimed that Amigos members were not consistently utilizing the e-resource subscription discounts. He stated, "Other programs are utilized more consistently and long term, but not by all members. These include e-resource subscription discounts" (Hair, 2011). I would venture to say that this continues today. I know this is true for most members of the ACCLC. There are most likely a variety of variables that contribute to this inconsistency. One assumption is that the discounted resources are not ubiquitously utilized. Amigos Library Services is well-positioned and has an excellent opportunity to play a major role in the negotiation and procurement of bibliographic databases for its members. It may be beneficial to investigate most common use of resources by academic library members and approach the vendors from a united front of all academic library members. Offering discounts on the expensive databases most commonly used across all members will put weight behind the continued value of an Amigos membership.
