# From the Board Chair

Dear Amigos Community:

The 2024-25 membership year saw continued action and movement across the Amigos network – and new plans to help bring increased benefits to Amigos member and partner libraries.

This year's notable accomplishments include a new website, new efforts to engage with member libraries, the formal launch of Amigos' digital repository service, and a major enhancement to member benefits. This year's report will feature those accomplishments along with our continued good work in resource sharing, continuing education, and technology services.

As Board Chair, I want to highlight my fellow board members' efforts to represent and engage libraries across our region, with board directors representing different states and library types and meetings that move us around the South Central and Southwest United States. This year, the Board met in Tulsa, Dallas, and San Antonio, providing opportunities to visit and meet with the staffs at Tulsa Community College Libraries, Tulsa City-County Library, Southern Methodist University Libraries, and the University of the Incarnate Word Libraries.

As many of you know, the Amigos Board has focused its efforts on supporting library staff and member libraries. Recent investments have included a first of its kind partnership with Skilltype to bring a new talent management platform to member libraries and our consortium agreement with the National Information Standards Organization (NISO) that provides NISO Library Standards Alliance (LSA) membership to all Amigos member libraries and staff.

At our 2025 Member Business Meeting in May, we announced our latest investment in member benefits and a demonstration of our commitment to investing in library staff. Beginning in the 2025-26 membership year, Amigos' Live Online continuing education sessions will be added to the list of offerings provided as a free benefit of membership. This addition encompasses all single- and multi-part sessions focused on various practical and specialized skills. As a result, all staff at Amigos member libraries will be able to attend Amigos Know & Go sessions, Online Conferences, Community Conversations, and Live Online courses at no additional cost. Nearly 3,000 learners participated in sessions in our 2024-25 membership year, and we look forward to an even larger community of learners with this new announcement for 2025-26.

Amigos continues its work as a valued partner in initiatives across the library community. Amigos' work with the Missouri Libraries 2 Go consortium helps more than 100 public libraries share over 108,000 ebooks and audiobooks. Our Association Management Services support a range of organizations, including the Library Marketing and Communications Conference, the Louisiana Library Association (LLA), the Oklahoma Library Association (OLA), and our newest partner, the Kansas Library Association (KLA). Amigos' Technology Solutions team has prepared the Hyku digital repository solution for launch in the Fall of 2025. Hyku provides a robust and flexible platform for institutions to manage and provide access to digital content and is supported by a growing community of open-source supporters.

Amigos' staff continue to improve operations for the benefit of members. This year's investments included a new website and a new registration system for our continuing education programs. Our previous investments in ConsortiaManager have improved members' experiences with renewal and subscriptions through Amigos Member Discount Services program. The Trans-Amigos Express and TExpress courier services have experienced improvement in delivery and tracking following the development of a new label maker for participating libraries.

And Amigos continues to look forward. Over the past year, we have engaged in focus groups with member public libraries, a survey of academic libraries' interest in open-source technology solutions, and continued engagement with member library leaders as instructors and facilitators for our continuing education sessions. These efforts help shape our future and build a stronger network of libraries.

The Board of Directors works with the best interests of members in mind, and it remains a rewarding experience to serve on the Board. I want to thank my fellow board members for their dedicated work and engagement. And we thank you for your continued partnership and look forward to more work ahead!

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# Products & Partnerships

## LIBRARIES SAVE THROUGH MEMBER DISCOUNT SERVICES

Through the Member Discount Services (MDS) group purchasing program, more than 200 libraries obtained specially negotiated member discounts on subscriptions to databases and journals from Amigos' vendor partners. Collectively, over the 2024-25 membership year, members saved more than \$2.9 million in discounts. Partnerships with vendors such as ABC-CLIO, ACM, BioOne, Bloomsbury, Mango, New York Times, and OVID allow members to offer resources that support their communities.

This year, Amigos' efforts to respond to member needs and deliver benefits that advance their work resulted in an expansion of the roster of discount vendors. We introduced three new partners—Edcetera, HeinOnline, and Schlager Group—each offering unique resources that support professional growth and research excellence.

- Edcetera provides continuing education opportunities and professional development tools, helping members stay ahead in a rapidly evolving landscape.
- HeinOnline brings access to an extensive collection of legal and historical research materials, enhancing scholarly and practical work.
- Schlager Group offers authoritative reference content that enriches research and learning experiences across disciplines.

These partnerships reflect our ongoing efforts to respond to member needs and deliver tangible benefits that advance their work.

## PUBLIC LIBRARIES DISCUSS A CHANGING RESOURCE ENVIRONMENT

Amigos continued its commitment to being member-led and member-centered by engaging public libraries in focus groups on electronic resource decision-making. Attendees discussed a wide range of topics. Public libraries are increasingly focused on addressing the challenges posed by AI-generated content, with some revising policies and emphasizing the need for AI literacy training. Emerging trends indicate continued strong interest in ebooks and open-access materials, career and homework-help resources, and services such as grant writing, legal tools, and online learning, though pricing and limited budgets remain significant obstacles.

These collaborative sessions provided valuable insights into database selection, subscription evaluation, and strategies for improving community access to information. Feedback from participants will directly guide Amigos in selecting future vendor partners to better serve member needs.


## A ROBUST AND FLEXIBLE DIGITAL REPOSITORY PLATFORM FOR INSTITUTIONS OF ANY SIZE

Amigos will begin the 2025-26 member year ready to welcome libraries to its Hyku digital repository service. Hyku provides a robust and flexible platform for institutions to manage and provide access to digital content. Providing easy-to-configure, feature-rich solutions, Hyku reduces barriers to effective asset management and is supported by a vibrant and ever-growing open-source community. The software is supported by an expanding community of academic libraries and consortia and builds on the Samvera Hyrax platform utilized by many larger institutions.

Through 2024-25, Amigos staff worked with selected member libraries to explore Hyku, providing repositories for libraries to share and test with their staff. Amigos appreciates the engagement with member libraries to help guide the development and selection of Hyku as a new service for members and looks forward to new technology solutions to share with libraries across the region.



## PROVIDING OPEN-SOURCE TECHNOLOGY SOLUTIONS FOR LIBRARIES



*A survey of academic libraries' needs for hosted technology solutions*

In November, Amigos initiated a survey of academic libraries' interest in and priorities for hosted technology solutions. The survey focused on small- to mid-sized academic libraries in Arizona and Arkansas, as a sample of broader needs across the region.

The survey sought to understand libraries' interest in hosted solutions for authoring or publishing tools, content management systems, digital library or collections platforms, discovery systems, library services platforms and integrated library systems, preservation systems, proxy services, and research data management systems.

Responding academic libraries indicated an interest in digital library or collections platforms, with many confirming interest in tools like Hyku that might provide affordable and sustainable solutions for accessing and managing resources without the need for on-premise infrastructure. At the same time, most responding libraries indicated concerns for budget and staffing, which might prevent implementation of needed solutions.

The results of this survey and continued member engagement have encouraged Amigos' Technology Solutions work, focusing on the shared technical expertise, product implementation, and ongoing support that library consortia can provide to libraries of different sizes. As Amigos invests in feature development to make Hyku a more affordable and attractive solution for libraries' repository needs, we continue to explore the next solutions that respond to libraries' evolving roles in communities.

# Resource Sharing & Services

## COURIER SUPPORTS RESOURCE SHARING ACROSS THE REGION

Over 240,000 library items shipped through the Trans-Amigos Express (TAE) courier program in membership year 2024-25. With a flat-rate annual fee, TAE saved participants thousands of dollars on packaging and shipping while providing rapid pick-up and delivery of interlibrary loan materials.

TExpress, a partnership between the Texas State Library and Archives Commission and Amigos, provided courier service to 204 Texas libraries.

More than 303 Amigos member libraries participated in the Amigos Resource Sharing Agreement, accessing free loans and copies from member libraries and over 200 libraries in the South Central and Southwest regions of the United States.




## ENHANCING COURIER SERVICES WITH THE TAE LABEL MAKER

In 2023, the Amigos Trans-Amigos Express (TAE) Courier introduced a Label Maker designed to streamline courier processes and improve the user experience. This tool made managing shipments more efficient.

A new statistics component was introduced in September 2024. To support adoption, TAE staff hosted two Q&A sessions focused on this feature, which allows participants to update and track courier data directly within the system. These sessions drew strong engagement, with more than 90 attendees participating. This upgrade replaces the previous reporting system and reflects Amigos' commitment to continuous improvement in service efficiency and member support.

## ANNUAL SURVEY REVEALS HIGH SATISFACTION FROM TEXPRESS



### *TExpress Service Meeting Library Needs*

As part of the partnership with Texas State Library and Archives Commission, Amigos conducted the Annual Courier Survey to assess user satisfaction with the TExpress service. With overall satisfaction of service, problem resolution, and other quality indicators continuing to trend upwards, survey results indicate restored confidence in the service since the pandemic year's reported low numbers. Consistent with last year's outcomes, 92% of respondents said they "Agree" or "Strongly Agree" the TExpress courier service meets their library needs, while 8% "Neither Agree/Disagree" with the statement and zero responded that they "Strongly Disagree" or "Disagree" (see chart above). Additionally, 94% of respondents "Agree" or "Strongly Agree" that the TExpress courier service helps improve library services to the public.

## LIBRARIES SHARE WITH THE MISSOURI LIBRARIES 2 GO GROUP

The Amigos-administered Missouri Libraries 2 Go (MOLIB2GO) group, comprising over 120 public libraries with similar interests and patron populations, continued to collaborate to share a collection of over 117,000 ebooks, audiobooks, and online magazines. MOLIB2GO libraries checked out over 1.8 million items in 2025. Popular genres include Romance, Thriller and Suspense, followed by Fantasy and Historical Fiction. Audiobook checkouts continue to grow, mirroring the trend seen across other online services. Online magazines provided readers with easy access to popular titles across a wide range of subjects, from cooking and entertainment to news and science.

# Education & Events

## OPPORTUNITIES ABOUND WITH CONTINUING EDUCATION

More than 3,900 registered attendees and learners participated in Amigos' continuing education and training opportunities. Members engaged in thirty-five scheduled Live Online courses, thirty-one free Know & Go sessions, two member-exclusive Community Conversations, two face-to-face workshops, three online conferences, and the 2025 Annual Amigos Member Conference. ## PLANNING FOR A MAJOR NEW MEMBER BENEFIT

As shared at the Amigos Member Business Meeting and in these pages, Live Online sessions were added to the long list of continuing education offerings provided as a free benefit of membership.

Amigos had long offered our Know & Go and Online Conferences as a free benefit of membership. But beginning this year, the Continuing Education Services team began to experiment with new offerings, including our Essentials series, focused on perennial topics of potential interest to staff at all levels and including Customer Service, the Reference Interview, Library Values, and Workplace Communication. The response to the Essentials series was significant – large registration numbers, of course, but also a learning community that included more staff from more institutions than many of our other offerings.

With the guidance of the Board of Directors, Continuing Education Services put a plan in place to open more of our sessions for free to members. Beginning in May 2025, Amigos members were eligible to register for all continuing education sessions for free. Our learning community has only grown – over 1,000 unique registrants from over 250 member institutions have joined Amigos' Live Online sessions since implementing this plan in May. We thank you for your engagement and your continued interest in professional development.



## COMMUNITY CONVERSATIONS FOSTER DIALOGUE ACROSS LEADERS

Amigos hosted two community conversations focused on critical issues in the library profession. A December 2024 Community Conversation shared successful practices for developing community support through library partnerships. Led by public library directors from Missouri, the session promoted successful initiatives adaptable to libraries of all sizes. An April 2025 Community Conversation, *By Any Other Name: Belonging and Engagement in Libraries*, highlighted libraries' ongoing commitments to professional values even in the face of challenges to diversity, equity, and inclusion initiatives. Leaders from public and academic libraries shared their adaptive strategies while encouraging a steady course true to the purpose of libraries in communities.

## ONLINE CONFERENCES PROVIDE FULL DAYS OF LEARNING AND NETWORKING

With three online conferences and an annual member conference, Amigos continues to provide focused days of learning that foster networking and idea-sharing. Amigos' three themed online conferences explored library staffing, collections and technical services, and the library user experience. With expert keynotes and sessions from member libraries, online conferences pack over twenty information-filled sessions into three convenient days of learning.

The Amigos Annual Member Conference provides an end-of-year cap with keynotes from member library deans and directors, an organizational update in the member business meeting, and informative sessions from staff at Amigos and Amigos member libraries.

## A NETWORK OF LEARNERS AND LEADERS

Amigos continuing education offerings bring learners together, but they increasingly highlight leaders from across the region. In 2025, Amigos was fortunate to host nearly 25 library leaders as presenters and instructors in its Live Online, Know & Go, and Community Conversation sessions – and most of those from member libraries.

Providing a venue for individuals to share their knowledge, demonstrate their expertise, and promote their individual and institutions accomplishments is key to a strong community of learners. As member leaders take the stage in Amigos continuing education offerings, they help forge connections across libraries and the wider region.

## A RETURN TO IN-PERSON TRAINING

In April, Amigos hosted preservation expert Rebecca Elder for a Book Repair Basics workshop at its Dallas offices. Elder facilitated two hands-on learning sessions for staff from member libraries in the Dallas region and from as far away as Arizona.

The Book Repair Basics session marked a return to in-person training for Amigos and resulted from direct requests from member library leaders. Based on the response to the Book Repair Basics session in Dallas, additional sessions are planned in Missouri and Texas for 2026. And Amigos continues to explore options to bring its in-person training options to the region.

# Membership & People

## CONFERENCE SPONSORSHIPS SUPPORT MEMBERS

Each year, Amigos supports professional development by offering scholarship awards to help members attend conferences and grow in their roles. This year, three individuals (Donna Church, Majestie Varnado, and Taylor M. Moore) from Amigos member libraries attended the Electronic Resources & Libraries 2025 Conference with support from Amigos and shared their takeaways with us. Whether new to the profession or stepping into a more specialized role, each found the conference valuable for its focused content, professional camaraderie, and practical takeaways. From licensing strategies and user analytics to accessible design and engagement ideas, their reflections highlight how ER&L helps library workers stay current, connected, and inspired.

Amigos sponsored scholarships for eight individuals (Michelle Pfalzgraf, Megan Horn, Kimberly Wallace, Gerardo Guzman, Donna Graham, Charis Vieira, Glenda Jones, and Vanesa Chappell) from member libraries to virtually attend the recent Northwest Interlibrary Loan & Resource Sharing (NWILL) Conference, allowing them to participate virtually in sessions on the latest trends and best practices in ILL and resource sharing.

## NISO MEMBERSHIP BROADENS EDUCATIONAL ACCESS

Amigos now extends National Information Standards Organization (NISO) Library Standards Alliance (LSA) membership to all Amigos libraries. This LSA membership includes free access to NISO's educational webinar program, unlimited participation in NISO Working Groups/Standing Committees, and discounted registration for all non-webinar events, including the annual NISO Plus conference. Over 100 Amigos member libraries attended NISO events this year, and all members had access to fourteen free-to-members webinars and four discounted-to-members educational events in fiscal year 2025.

## REDESIGNED AND UPDATED WEBSITE LAUNCHED

Amigos launched a redesigned website featuring a modern look and improved functionality to enhance user experience. The new site offers streamlined navigation, making it easier for members and visitors to access resources, join the organization, and enroll in courses. This upgrade reflects Amigos' commitment to providing an intuitive and accessible platform for all users.

## SUPPORTING PROFESSIONAL AND LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT FOR ASSOCIATION CLIENTS

Introduced in 2024, Amigos continued its new Library Association Leaders Learn & Share series in 2025, with two sessions: *Elevate Your Engagement: Strategies for Effective Marketing and Communication in Associations* and *Boost Your Ranks: Growing Your Association Membership*.

Designed to give client association leaders an opportunity to come together to learn from each other, the online event series will continue to address relevant topics in library association leadership.

Amigos supported events and conferences for six professional organizations, including: Wyoming Library Association, St. Louis Regional Library Network, Oberlin Library Group, Oklahoma Library Association, Louisiana Library Association, and Library Marketing Conference Group.

The Kansas Library Association (KLA) signed an agreement with Amigos for professional association management services beginning with the 2026 fiscal year (July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026). Amigos is looking forward to providing support to KLA in key areas, including membership, administration, financial management, and event coordination.

## STAFF RECRUITMENT THROUGH AMIGOS JOB BANK

Posting openings on the Amigos Job Bank provides member libraries free access to a popular site with those searching for employment. Upwards of 200 positions at over 70 institutions received national visibility for openings reaching job seekers across the country.

## ALA RDA TOOLKIT BENEFITS MEMBER LIBRARIES

Over 160 member libraries accessed a free single-user sign-on to the ALA RDA Toolkit, an essential package of data elements, guidelines, and instructions for creating library resource metadata that are well-formed for user-focused linked data applications.
